## Program Overview

- A 2.5 yr, \$1.2M research project that examined systemic organic supply chain barriers in six Canadian commodities.

## Outcomes

- Six bilingual organic supply chain reports with recommendations for action
- A white paper that examined the environmental impacts (GHGs) of organic supply chains
- Soil samples collected (close to 100) from organic producers - data to be used in meta analyses

## Activities

- Intensive, pan-Canadian research conducted on the following organic commodities: blueberries, carrots, field peas, salad greens, oats and beef
- Hosted six organic supply chain webinars and now available to view
